Marmalade Cake Recipes

Marmalade Muffins

Ingredients

175g plain flour
25g porridge oats, plus extra for sprinkling
175g light soft brown sugar
1 tsp baking powder
½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
zest and juice 1 orange
1 tbsp sunflower oil
150g pot plain yogurt
1 large egg
9 tsp chunky marmalade

Method

Step 1

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/ gas 6 and line a muffin tin with 9 paper cases.

Combine the flour, oats, sugar, baking powder and bicarb in a bowl.

Whisk the orange zest and juice, oil, yogurt, and egg together with a fork, then lightly stir the 2 mixtures together until just combined.

Step 2

Spoon 1 tbsp of the mixture into each muffin case.

Top with 1 tsp of marmalade, then cover with the remaining muffin mix and a sprinkling of oats.

Bake for 15-20 mins until cooked through and golden, then leave to cool slightly

Plain Marmalade Cake

Ingredients:

200g plain flour

1tsp baking powder

100g soft butter

75g soft brown sugar

2 large eggs

5 tablespoons marmalade (a great way to use leftovers or use your favourite)

Method

Put all the ingredients in a food processor and blitz for 15 - 20 seconds. Pour into a smallish loaf tin (lined) and cook at 180 C for 40 mins to an hour (depends on your oven). It's cooked when it has begun to shrink from the sides and a skewer comes out clean when pushed into the centre. Will keep for several days in an airtight tin.

Sticky Orange Marmalade Cake

Ingredients

120 g unsalted butter - allowed to soften 100 g caster sugar 2 eggs - lightly beaten 120 g plain flour pinch salt 1 ½ tsp baking powder 3 tbsp Seville orange marmalade 2 tbsp milk

For the icing

1 tbsp marmalade50 g icing sugar1 tbsp warm water


Method

Preheat oven to 160°C (fan)/ 320°F/gas mark 4. Butter a 15cm/6" loaf tin, and line with baking parchment/silicone paper. Beat the butter with a wooden spoon or electric mixer until creamy. Add the sugar and beat until the mixture lightens in colour and becomes fluffy. Beat in the eggs. Mix together the flour, salt and baking powder well in a separate bowl and add to the butter, sugar and egg mixture. Fold in the flour. Add the marmalade and milk, and fold in as well. Spoon the mixture into the loaf tin and spread. Bake for about 50 – 55 mins until golden brown and firm to the touch, and when a cocktail stick is poked into the cake it comes out clean. Allow to cool for 5 minutes then run a round blade knife round the inside of the tin and turn out onto a wire rack.

For the sticky marmalade glaze Sift the icing sugar into a bowl, add the warm water and mix. Stir in the marmalade. Spoon the mix over the cake, letting it run down the sides. Leave to set before cutting.

Whizzer


1. Cut ~5cm strip from the top of a pack of crepe paper.



2. Take a spring peg and a piece of string ~1m long and thread the string through the hole on the peg, and tie.



3. Open the crepe paper, fold over ~2cm at one end and clip the peg on the end.



4. Find an open space, hold the loose end of the string, and swing the Whizzer.
